

### --PROCEEDINGS

The Indian Bottom Association of Old Regular Baptist Churches of Jesus Christ met with Big Cowan Church, Dongola, Letcher Co., Ky. Sept. 3-4-5, 1926, and after singing by the congregation and prayer by Eld. Ira Combs, the introductory sermon was preached by Eld. W. G. Combs. After a short intermission the delegates assembled at the school house and after prayer by Eld. W. R. Boggs the Association proceeded in the following manner:

1 The Moderator then called for letters from the churches that composed the Indian Bottom Association. Letters received and

read and delegates seated as shown in table of statistics.

2 The Association then organized by electing Eld. D. M. Maggard Moderator, Eld. Ira Combs, Asst. Moderator, Geo. B. Ison Clerk.

3 On motion the Articles of Faith read, Rules of Decorum and Constituion were omitted.

4 Called for newly constituted churches of the same faith and or-

der and received none.

5 Called for corresponding letters from sister Associations and received the following: Union Association with file of minutes by the hands of her delegates, Eld. Joe Hall, R. A. Baker, Ira Mullins and W. F. Adington, who were given the right hand of fellowship and took seats with us and aided in counsel; New Salem Association with letter by the hands of her delgates, Eld Hiram Hall, F.A. Hopkins, who were given the right hand of fellowship and took seats with us and aided in counsel.

6 Called for transient ministers and members of same faith and

order and received Eld. G. B. Adams.

7 On motion the Moderator was authorized to make all temporary

appointments during this session of the Association.

8 Appointed committee to arrange the ministry for Saturday consisting of one member from each of the churches with the entire delegation from Big Cowan Church, who reported to open first G. C. Riddle, second Hiram Hall, third Ballard Baker, fourth Ira Mullins, fifth G. B. Adams.

9 Appointed the Clerk to write the corresponding letters to Un-

ion and New Salem Associations.

10 Appointed a committee on arrangements consisting of one delegate from each church with the Moderators and Clerks, corresponding transient ministers and members invited to arrange the business for tomorrow.

11 On motion the Association adjourned until tomorrow morning at nine o'clock.

SATURDAY MORNING, SEPT. 4, 1926
Met pursuant to adjournment and after singing by the delegates

and prayer by Eld. Ira Combs, the Association then proceeded to business in the following manner:

1 Called the names of the delegates and marked the absentees. 2 Cailed the committee on arrangements to report, who reported and wore discharged.

3 Called for transient ministers and members and received none. 4 On motion the ministers who were appointed to preach on the

stand for the day were excused.

5 Appointed a committee on finance who received the contributions from the churches as shown in table of statistics amounting to \$81.77 and \$6 from old treasurer which was turned over to Cec. B. Ison, Treas. Total amount \$87.77.

6 Appeared the same committee on ministry as of yesterday, who reported the following ministers to preach on the stand for Sunday: 1 Eld. W. R. Boggs, S.D. M. Maggaria, F. A. Hopkins, 4 Ira Combs, 5 Joe Hall.

7 Called on present Secretary and Treasurer to report, who reported \$90.48-\$75 printing-\$6 to G. B. Ison-\$9.48 expenses, and resigned; and the Association appointd Eld. Geo. B. Ison and ordered that 1500 copies of the Association minutes be printed, reserve 200 copies for sister associations and to distribute the remainder among the churches in proportion to contributions and so as to give each church enough to supply its members.

8 On motion it is ordered that Eld. Geo. B. Ison, Treas., make settlement with former treasurer, and that said former treasurer turn over whatever amount of the Association's funds that he may have left in his hands to the present Treasurer, Geo. B. Ison.

- 9 Called on brethren appointed to write letters to sister Associations. The letter to Union Association was read, received, and appointed Eld. D. M. Maggard, Ira Combs and others to attend, the letter to New Salem Association was read, received, and appointed Elds. Ira Combs, G. B. Ison, G. M. Caudill and others to attend. Union letter in hands of D. M. Maggard, New Salem letter in the hands of G. B. Ison.
- 10, Called on brethren appointed last year to attend sister Associations and union meetings to report, who reported and those who failed to attend were excused.
- 11 Appointed Union meetings as follows: Conway church, first Saturday and Sunday in July 1927, Elds. D. M. Maggard, F. G. Fields, W. M. Scott. Bros. D. P. Boggs, Isaac Fields, John Day to attend. Hurricane Gap church, second Saturday and Sunday in June 1927, Elds. D.M. Maggard, G. M. Caudill, F. G. Fields. Oven Fork church second Saturday and Sunday in July 1927, Elds. G.C.

Riddle, Ira McKnight, G.M.Caudill. Big Leatherwood church, second Saturday and Sunday in July 1927, Elds. G.C.Riddle, G.M.Caudill, W. G. Combs. Little Dove church, third Saturday and Sunday in August 1927, Elds. G.M. Caudill, G. C. iddle. Indian Bottom church, first Saturday and Sunday in August 1927, Elds. Ira Combs. G.C.Riddle, W.G.Combs. to attend as named.

12 Took up Mallet Fork church trouble and discussed same, and

said church was put back in fellowship and in order.

13 We want to express our sincere thanks to the Big Cowan Church and Community for all favors and kindness shown.

14 It is ordered that W.T.Francis make settlement with G. B. Ison and turn over to him all money in his hands.

### RESOLUTIONS

1 Resolved that the Clerk supply all omissions that may have been made by oversight.

2 Resolved, that the Articles of Faith, Rules of Decorum and Constitution and Form of Church Letter be printed in our minutes.

3 Resolved that this Association pay actual expenses, such as railroad fare and hotel bills of delegates of this Association who attend our sister Associations and the Treasurer, G. B. Ison, is hereby authorized to pay same and take credit in his next report.

4 Resolved that the delegates of the Association not leave the

Association until the final close.

5 Resolved, that we print in our minutes the chituaries of our deceased members and that the same be furnished the Secretary

6 Resolved, that our next Association be held with Clear Creek Church, Fisty, Knott C., Ky., on Friday before first Saturday in September, 1927, and that Eld. W.G.Combs preach the introductory sermon and Eld. J.T.Whitaker be his alternate.

7 Resolved, that the Association give her compliments to the Big Cowan Church and the citizens in and around Dongola for their kindness and good treatment during this session of Associa-

tion.

8, On motion and second this Association adjourned until the time and place of our next Association.

SUNDAY MORNING, SEPT. 5, 1926

Eld. G. B. Ison, Clerk,

The Brethren appointed to preach on the stand for Sunday met a large and well ordered congregation and preached as follows: 1 Eld. W.R.Boggs to open, 2 D. M. Maggard, text St. John 3:16, "For God so loved the world," 3 F.A.Hopkins, text, 1 Tim. 3:16, "And without controversy great is the mystery of God," 4 Ira Combs,

text "There was a man sent from God." 5, Joe Hall, text St. John 4:13-14 "Jesus answered and said unto her, whosoever drinketh of this water will thirst again." The preaching was a unit throughout the whole session of the Association and the rejoicing of the saints, as we feel, one of the best sessions of this Association passed into history. CONSTITUTION

Having by unanimous voice changed our organization from an annual union meeting to an association, we, therefore, propose to keep the order and rules of an Association according to the following form of government:

1 The Association shall be called "The Indian Bottom Associa-

tion."

2 The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the different churches in our Union and duly sent to represent them in the Association, who shall be members whom they judge best qualified for that purpose, and producing letters from their churches certifying their appointment, shall be entitled to a seat.

3 In the letters from the different churches shall be expressed their number in full fellowship; those baptized, received by letter, restoration, application, dismissed, excluded and decased since our

last Association.

4 The members thus chosen and convened shall have no power to lord over God's heritage, nor shall they have any clerical power over the churches, nor shall they infringe on the rights of any of the churches in the Union.

5 The Association when convened shall be governed by a regular

and proper decorum.

6The Association shall have a Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer

who shall be chosen by the suffrage of the members present.

7 New churches may be admitted into this Union, which shall petition by letter and delegates, and if found upon examination to be orthodox and orderly shall be received by the Association and manifested by the Moderator giving the right hand of fellowship.

8 Every church in the Union shall be entitled to representation

in the Association.

9 Every query presented by the church to the Association, being first debated in their own church, shall come under the consideration of the Association.

10 Every motion made and seconded shall be considered by the Association except it be withdrawn by the party who made it.

11 We think it absolutely necessary that we have an Association fund for defraying the expenses of the same for the raising of

which we think it the duty of each church in the Union to contribute such sums volutarily as they think proper, and send it by their delegates to the Association, and the amount so received shall be deposited with the Treasurer, who shall be responsible to the Association and pay same out as the Association may direct.

12 There shall be an Association book kept in which the proceedings of every Association shall be regularly recorded by the Sec-

13 The minutes of the Association shall be read and corrected,if need be, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk before the Association rises.

14 Amendments to this plan of government may be made at any time by a majority of the Union, when it may so desire.

15 The Association shall endeavor to furnish the churches with minutes of the Association. The best method of effecting same shall be determined by the Association.

16 All matters coming before the Association shall be decided by will of a majority of the members present, except in receiving and dismissing churches and Associations, which shall be by a

unanimous vote.

17 The Association shall have power to decide for the general Union of the churches and to preserve an inviolable chain of communion among same, giving the churches all necessary advice in matters of church difficulty; inquire into the cause why any church shall have failed to represent itself at any time in the Association; appropriate the money received to any purpose it may think proper; appoint any member or members, by their consent, to transact any business which it may think necessary; withdraw from any church in the Union which may violate any of the rules of the Asociation or deviate from the Orthodox principles of religion; admit any orderly minister of our Faith and Order to a seat in the Association; and adjourn to any future time or place it may deem necssary.

### RULES OF DECORUM

1 The Association shall be opened and closed with prayer.

2 A Moderator and Clerk shall be chosen by the suffrage of the members present.

3 Only one member shall speak at a time and shall rise from his seat when he is about to speak.

4 The person speaking shall not be interrupted in his speech by anyone except the Moderator until he is done speaking.

5 He shall strictly adhere to his subject and in no wise reflect on

the preceding speaker, but shall define his ideas on the proposition for debate as far as he can.

6 No person shall abruptly absent himself from the Association

without leave of the same.

7 No person shall rise and speak more than three times on any one subject without permission of the Association.

8 No member of the Association shall have liberty to laugh during the sitting of same, nor whisper in time of public speech.

9 No member shall address another by any other name or term

than that of Brother.

10 The Moderator shall not interrupt or prohibit a member from speaking until he gives his views on the subject, unless he shall have violated the rules of decorum.

11 The names of the several members of the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as the Association may

12 The Moderator shall be entitled to the same privileges of speech as another member, provided the chair be filled, but he shall have no vote unless the Association be equally divided, in that event he shall give the casting vote.

13 Any member who shall willingly and knowingly violate any of these rules shall be reprimanded by the Association as it may

think proper.

### ARTICLES OF FAITH

1 We believe in the one true and living God; and notwithstanding there are Three that bear record in Heaven, the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, yet there is but one in substance, equal in power and glory, not to be divided and impossible to change in principle or practice.

2 We believe that the Old and New Testament Scriptures are the true written words of God and were given by inspiration of Gid, and there is a sufficiency in them contained for our instruction, and they are the only rule of our faith and practice.

3We believe in the doctrine of original sin and that men sinned

since the fall, and are by nature the children of wrath.

4 We believe in the impotency or inability of men to recover themselves out of the state they are in; therefore, a Saviour is absolutely needed.

5 We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God, only by the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ.

6 We believe in the perseverance of the Saints, that through grace they are born again and adopted into the family of Heaven; that they become equal heirs with Jesus Christ in Glory and that He will raise them up at the last.

7 We believe that Baptism and the Lord's Supper are Gospel Ordinances; that true believers are the proper subjects and we admit of no other.

8 We believe that the true mode of Baptism is by immersion, to baptize a person by their own consent, back foremost in water in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost.

9 We believe that washing one another's feet is a commandment of Christ left on record with His disciples and ought to be practiced by His followers.

10 We believe in the resurrection of the dead and general judgment when all will be judged according to their deeds done in the body.

11 We believe the punishment of the wicked will be everlasting and the joys of the righteous will be eternal after death.

12 We believe that no one has a right to administer the Gospel Ordinances but such as are legally called and qualified thereunto.

13 We believe it to be the duty of all church members to attend church meetings and that it is the duty of the church to deal with them for neglecting the same.

15 We believe it to be the duty of all church members to contribute to the support of the church by defraying all reasonable expenses of the same, never neglecting the poor according to their several abilities.

15 We believe that any doctrine that goes to encourage or indulge the people in their sins or to cause them to settle down on anything short of saving grace in Christ for Salvation is erroneous and such doctrine will be rejected by us.

16 None of the above articles shall be construed as to hold with particular eletion or reprobation so as to make God partial, directly or indirectly, so as to injure children of men.

17 No one of the above articles shall be altered without legal notice and free consent.
