



MINUTES OF THE ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTEENTH ANNUAL SESSION OF THE INDIAN BOTTOM ASSOCIATION OF OLD REGULAR BAPTIST CHURCHES OF JESUS CHRIST FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 3RD, 2010 AND THE TWO FOLLOWING DAYS

The Indian Bottom Association, being in session, assembled at our association building at Sassafras, Knott County, Kentucky, on September 3, 2010 and the two following days. Hosted by the Tolson Creek Church and co-hosted by the Friendship, Chester Hogg Memorial, Little Zion and Clear Fork Churches, the association met in the congregational department of the association building for preaching services. After singing some songs of Zion, Elder Ronnie Robinson introduced the service and Elder James Slone led in prayer. Elder Merle Caudill followed with the introductory sermon.

The delegates were dismissed from the congregational department and asked to assemble in the delegate room. Brothers Joe Grimm, Felden Ruggles, Jr., Darryl Slone and Frank Fouts were appointed by the moderator to remain in the congregational department for preaching services. In the delegate room, Elder Elwood Cornett welcomed the delegates and called upon Brother Roy Slone to introduce the session and Elder Clinton Moore to lead in prayer. The Association, now being assembled, was called to order by Elder Elwood Cornett, the moderator. He appointed a finance committee to wit: John Reedy, Jeff Combs and Eddie Creech. He then called for the letters of the several churches that compose the Indian Bottom Association.

- 1. A motion was made, seconded, and passed with no objection, to read the letter of the Tolson Creek Church. The letter was read by the clerk. By a move and second, with no objection, it was received, along with all other church letters, as they were in regular form; the delegates were seated and all requests and queries were referred to the Committee on Arrangements. A letter was not received from the Hurricane Gap Church.
- 2. The Association was then organized by choosing the following officers:

Elder Elwood Cornett, Moderator Elder Jim Fields, Assistant Moderator Elder Don Pratt, Clerk/Treasurer Brother Bob Banks, Assistant Clerk

(The following brothers were appointed to count the votes: Randy Campbell, Randy Blair and Marvin Caudill.)

- 3. By a move and second, with no objection, the moderator was directed to make all temporary appointments.
- 4. The moderator appointed a Committee on Ministry composed of one delegate from each of the churches to arrange the preaching services for Friday afternoon and Saturday morning.
- 5. The moderator called for newly constituted churches desiring to take up fellowship with us: None responded.
- 6. Churches of our same faith and order who desired fellowship with us were called for: None responded.
- 7. By a move and second, with no objection, it was decided to omit the reading of the Articles of Faith, the Constitution and the Rules of Decorum. All were directed to be printed in the minutes.
- 8. The moderator called for transient members and ministers and the following responded: Brothers H.B. Reedy, Jr. and Dean Jacobs.
- 9. The Committee on Ministry made the following report for preaching services:

Friday afternoon: Brothers Wayne Smith and Alonzo Mosley.

Saturday morning: Brothers David O'Quinn, Ross Wright, James Caudill

and Alger Mullins.

- 10. The moderator appointed a Committee on Arrangements composed of one delegate from each church, together with the association moderator, assistant moderator, clerk and assistant clerk.
- 11. A move and second, with no objection, were made for the Committee on Arrangements to meet on Friday afternoon at 1:00 p.m. to arrange the business for Saturday.
- 12. By a move and second, with no objection, the Association was adjourned until 9:00 a.m. Saturday morning. The singing will start in the congregational department at 9:30 a.m.

The Committee on Arrangements met at 1:00 p.m. on Friday afternoon in the congregational department of the association building. After singing, Elder Wayne Smith introduced the service and led in prayer. Elder Alonzo Mosley then preached, after which the committee arranged the work for Saturday. Elder Terry Bryant called dismission.

SATURDAY MORNING

The association met pursuant to adjournment. After singing some songs of Zion, Elder Elwood Cornett, our moderator, welcomed everyone and called upon Elder Nelson Craft to introduce the session and Elder John Bowling to lead in prayer.

- 1. The clerk called the roll and marked the absentees.
- 2. The report of the Committee on Arrangements was given by the clerk of the association. A move and second were made to approve the report. There was an objection to the move and second. By a vote of 90 "yes" votes and 24 "no" votes, the motion carried, the report was approved and the committee was discharged.
- 3. The ministers chosen to preach on the stand were excused to go to the congregational department of the association building.
- 4. The Committee on Finance reported a sum of \$8,975.00 collected from the various churches. By a move and second, with no objection, the report was received and the committee discharged.
- 5. By a move and second, with no objection, the minutes of this session of the association were ordered to be printed. The clerk is to be secretary/treasurer and will decide how many copies to have printed and distributed to each church, according to the amount of money collected.
- 6. By a move and second, with no objection, the dates of the union, communion and memorial services and appointed meetings are to be printed in the minutes.
- 7. The circular letter was read by Elder Mickey Amburgey, who had been chosen last year to write a circular letter for approval by the association this year. By a move and second, with no objection, the letter was received and ordered to be printed in the minutes.
- 8. A. The Committee on Ministry, being the same as on Friday, chose the following ministers to preach on Sunday, to wit: Brothers Greg Lewis, Scottie Halcomb, Jim Blankenship, Jim Fields and Elwood Cornett.
 - B. The Committee on Ministry chose Elder Jim Blankenship to preach the introductory sermon for the 2011 session and Elder Hershall (Jimmy) Hall to be the alternate.
 - C. The Committee on Ministry chose Elder Jeff Combs to write a circular letter for consideration of approval next year.

- 9. By a move and second, with no objection, obituaries are to be printed in the minutes. Obituaries may be given to the clerks at any time during the year. They are to be typed and may be on paper, a computer disk/CD (MS Word) or emailed to the clerks.
- 10. The treasurer's report was given by the clerk. By a move and second, with no objection, the report was received and ordered to be printed in the minutes. The report is as follows:

12. The clerk read the report of the Committee on Council. By a move and second, with no objection, the report was approved. The report follows:

The Report of the Indian Bottom Association Council Committee, 2010

A number of brothers of churches in the Indian Bottom Association became aware that Hurricane Gap and Clear Fork Churches and Brother Charles Shepherd, their moderator, had violated orders of the association, including a mode of baptism without immersion and receiving members from other denominations by recommendation. Our moderator, Elder Elwood Cornett called the Indian Bottom Council Committee together to work out these difficulties with these churches. After several meetings the Council Committee decided in December, 2009 to send a letter to these two churches asking if they would agree to comply with the Constitution, Articles of Faith and Orders of the Indian Bottom Association.

The letter to the Clear Fork Church was delivered. At the December, 2009 business meeting of the Clear Fork Church, by move and second, the Church agreed to comply with the request of the Council Committee. The Council Committee, however, received a letter that closed with "Done and signed by Order of the Church" and signed by the moderator and clerk. According to members of the Church, this letter misrepresented the actions taken by the Church.

At the February, 2010 business meeting of the Clear Fork Church, the Church, by move and second without objection, again agreed to comply with the practices and procedures of the Indian Bottom Association. The Council Committee received a letter stating that the Clear Fork Church intended to comply with the request of the Committee on Council. The Clear Fork Church did comply with the request and the Committee on Council greatly appreciates the cooperation of the Clear Fork Church.

The letter to the Hurricane Gap Church was delivered to the moderator, Elder Charles Shepherd. The Council Committee was made aware that the letter was never read during a business meeting of the Hurricane Gap Church. Since the Church did not respond to the letter from the Council Committee, a meeting of the Council Committee was held at the Indian Bottom Association Building and all members of the Hurricane Gap Church were invited. The meeting was to make sure that all members were aware of the situation. After the meeting, letters were received by Indian Bottom Churches stating that the Hurricane Gap Church was not going to respond to the letter from the Council Committee.

Elder Elwood Cornett, our moderator, appointed the following brothers to serve as the Committee on Council for the next year. These brothers are: Jim Blankenship, Roger Fields, Danny Dixon, Alger Mullins, Darryl Slone, Roger Gibson, and Elwood Cornett.

13. The requests from the Little Dove Church to host the 2011 Association and the Bethlehem Church to co-host the 2011 Association were read. The requests were granted by a

move and second, with no objection. The Happy Home and Little Bethlehem Churches made verbal requests to co-host the 2011 Association. The requests were granted by a move and second, with no objection.

- 14. The clerk read the request from the Council Committee to drop the Hurricane Gap Church from the Indian Bottom Association and to allow our churches to receive by recommendation the Hurricane Gap Church members who meet the requirements of Item 12:A,10 of the 1999 Indian Bottom Association minutes. By a move and second, with no objection, the request was granted.
- 15. The request from the Clear Fork Church to change their monthly Saturday meeting time to 6:00 p.m. was read by the clerk. By a move and second, with no objection, the request was granted.
- 16. The request from the Mount Zion Church to change their monthly meeting time to the third Saturday and Sunday was read by the clerk. By a move and second, with no objection, the request was granted.
- 17. The request from the Garden of Love Church to change their third Saturday meeting time, as listed in the minutes, to 6:00 p.m. was read by the clerk. By a move and second, with no objection, the request was granted.
- 18. By a move and second, with no objection, the clerks were directed to write a tribute to the deceased ministers of the Indian Bottom Association.
- 19. By a move and second, with no objection, the clerks were directed to write a resolution of appreciation to the Tolson Creek, Friendship, Chester Hogg Memorial, Little Zion and Clear Fork Churches for hosting the 2010 session of the Indian Bottom Association.
- 20. There was a move and second, with no objection, to have services at the association building on the following odd-Sundays: October 31, January 30, May 1 and July 31.
- 21. By a move and second, with no objection, the reading of the minutes of the 2010 session of the Indian Bottom Association was omitted and ordered to be printed in the 2010 minute book.
- 22. By a move and second, with no objection, we adjourned until the 2011 session of the Indian Bottom Association convenes on September 2, 2011. The moderator called on Elder Eddie Newsome. He made a few remarks and led in the closing prayer.

SUNDAY

With heart-felt expressions of brotherly love for each other, a large crowd of brothers, sisters and friends gathered at the association building on this final day of the one hundred and fifteenth session of the Indian Bottom Association. After singing some songs of Zion, Elder Elwood Cornett, the moderator, welcomed the congregation. Elder Elwood then called upon Elder Jim Fields to introduce the service and lead in prayer. He was followed by Brothers Greg Lewis, Scottie Halcomb and Jim Blankenship. Elder Elwood Cornett then came forth and preached, bringing the meeting to a close. Elder Don Pratt led in the prayer of dismission, thus ending the 2010 session of the Indian Bottom Association.

I AM WITH YOU STILL






EDWIN "EDD" CAUDILL, SR.



He is survived by twelve grandchildren, twenty six great grandchildren, twenty eight great, great grandchildren, four great, great, great grandchildren and a host of relatives and friends to mourn his passing. Bill had been a member of the Blair Branch Church since May, 1984.

The following was written about Bill Gibson by Kimberly Adams Watts in the fall of 2009:

At the sprightly age of 105, Bill is living proof of 100 plus years of history in the making. He has been privy to the administrations of 19 U.S. presidents, 27 Kentucky governors, has witnessed six major wars and the

Great Depression, seen the rise and fall of prohibition, and observed the introduction of telephones and electricity into the mountains. Many in his surrounding community refer to him as a "walking history book" and consider him to be the leading source of knowledge on the first quarter of the 20th century. Having obtained an eighth grade education, and living during the era when Appalachia was geographically isolated from the rest of the world, his 105 years of wisdom and knowledge has come primarily from simple life experience and the tenacity to survive tough times.

When asked about his life story, one gains the understanding that the mountains and its people have changed drastically throughout the course of his life. Reflecting on an era when hard work, large families, and neighbor helping neighbor was the expected way of life, he admits it was a simpler and sweeter time. Born at home, he was one of 12 children of Delaney and Suzanne Amburgey Gibson. Remembering a warm but tough upbringing in his small community of Indian Creek, he recounts when children were birthed at home by midwives and doctors who made house calls on foot or horseback, and home remedies were the selected choice of medicine. Primary transportation for the family excluding their trusted mule was a 15 cent train ride to the nearest town. He recalls that the passenger trains ran daily from Neon to Hazard and were used to haul everything from people livestock and food. Cars were rarely used since most of the passable roads ran primarily in creek beds and gas was considered high at 3 cents per gallon. Marriages were usually done at home by a local preacher, and sometimes by traveling preachers who rode a circuit and would pass through the local communities about once or twice a month to perform weddings and have church services. Recalling his own wedding he grins broadly that he stole his bride Lonnie Amburgey (15 years of age) and almost got shot by his father in law for the deed. He grew up in the days of large families, prohibition, traveling salesmen, moonshine stills, and one room schools. Schools only remained in session about three to four months per year, they were required to be closed during planting and harvesting seasons so the school children could assist with plowing, planting and tending the fields. His first job at the age of nine was working as a "Water Boy" for a local mine for which he earned 25 cents per day. He remembers sadly the harshness of war time and the Great Depression when everything was rationed, families were given war rations and children only one pair of shoes per year.

A strong believer in old adage of an honest day's work for an honest day's pay, exercising your right to vote, and the freedom to worship, Bill staunchly states that without exercising any of the three, you have no right to complain. Described by his family and friends as being strong willed, unreserved, quick to give his opinion, and prompt in telling you "how things ought to be", he is respected as being the true patriarch of the Gibson family. Raising a garden until he was 98, he admits that gardening combined with doing hard physical work for much of his life has helped him to remain relatively healthy. When prompted to reveal his secret to his longevity of life he attributes his years to his faith in God, and his willingness to work. One of his proudest accomplishments was receiving a Centurion Award in 2004 from President George Bush, recognizes individuals who have lived 100 years or more. He is currently the oldest surviving member of his family, as well as the oldest living member of the Indian Bottom Association


CHRISTOPHER BRIAN "PEEPER" JONES






MARYANN JOYCE OSBORNE

With much sadness in my heart, I will try to write the obituary of a loving husband, father, grandfather, and great grandfather.



In loving memory of Cecil "Teaberry" Stamper, my Dad, I would like to present the following obituary.



Rest in peace. You will always be in my thoughts.






ARNOLD E. STEELE, JR. III

ROBERT LEE STILTNER







ARTICLES OF FAITH


- 1. We believe in the one true and living God, and not withstanding there are Three that bear record in Heaven, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, yet there is but one in substance, equal in power and glory, not to be divided and impossible to change in principle and practice.
- 2. We believe the Old and New Testament Scriptures are the true written words of God and were given by inspiration of God and there is a sufficiency in them contained for our instruction and they are the only rule of our faith and practice.
- 3. We believe the doctrine of original sin, and that man sinned since the fall, and that men are by nature the children of wrath.
- 4. We believe in the impotency or inability of men to recover themselves out of the state they are in; therefore, a Savior is absolutely needed.
- 5. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God only by the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ.
- 6. We believe in the perseverance of the Saints. That by grace through faith they are born again and adopted into the family of Heaven; that they will become equal heirs with Jesus Christ in glory, and that He will raise them up at the last day.
- 7. We believe that Baptism and the Lord's Supper are Gospel Ordinances; that true believers are the proper subjects and we admit no other.
- 8. We believe that the true mode of baptism is by immersion, to baptize a person by their own consent, back foremost in the water, in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost.

- 9. We believe that washing of one another's feet is a commandment of Christ, left on record with His disciples, and ought to be practiced by His followers.
- 10. We believe in the resurrection of the dead and general judgment when all will be judged according to their deeds done in the body.
- 11. We believe the punishment of the wicked will be everlasting and the joys of the righteous will be eternal after death.
- 12. We believe that no one has the right to administer the Gospel Ordinances but such as are legally ordained and qualified there unto.
- 13. We believe it to be the duty of all church members to attend church meetings, and that it is the duty of the church to deal with them for neglecting same.
- 14. We believe it to be the duty of all church members to contribute to the support of the church by defraying all reasonable expenses of same, never neglecting the poor, according to their several abilities.
- 15. We believe that any doctrine that goes to encourage or indulge the people in their sins or cause them to settle down on anything short of saving grace in Christ for salvation is erroneous and such doctrine will be rejected by us.
- 16. None of the above articles shall be construed as to hold with particular election or reprobation as to make God partial directly or indirectly so as to injure children of man.
- 17. None of the above articles shall be altered without legal notice and free consent.

RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. The Association shall open and close with prayer.
- 2. The moderator and assistant moderator, clerk and assistant clerk, shall be chosen by the suffrage of the members present.
- 3. Only one member shall speak at a time, and shall rise from his seat and address the moderator when he is about to speak.
- 4. The person thus speaking shall not be interrupted in his speech by anyone except the moderator until he is done.
- 5. He shall strictly adhere to his subject and in no wise reflect on the preceding speaker, but define his ideas on the proposition for debate, so far as he can.
- 6. No person shall abruptly absent himself from the Association without leave of the same.
- 7. No person shall rise and speak more than three times on any subject without permission from the Association.
- 8. No member of the Association shall

- have the liberty to laugh during the sitting of the same, nor whisper in time of public speech.
- 9. No member shall address another in any other form or term than that of "Brother."
- 10. The moderator shall not interrupt a brother or prohibit him from speaking until he gives his views on the subject unless he shall violate the Rules of Decorum.
- 11. The names of the several members of the Association shall be enrolled by the clerk, and called as often as the Association may require.
- 12. The moderator shall be entitled to the same privileges of speech as any other member, provided the chair be filled, but he shall have no vote unless the Association be equally divided, in which event he shall give the deciding vote.
- 13. Any member who shall willfully and knowingly violate any of these rules shall be reprimanded by the Association as it may think proper.



CONSTITUTION


Having by unanimous voice changed our organization from an annual meeting to an Association, we therefore propose to keep order and rules of an Association according to the following form of government:

- 1. The Association shall be called the Indian Bottom Association.
- 2. The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the different churches in our union, and duly sent to represent them in the Association, who shall be members whom they judge best qualified for that purpose, and producing letters from their respective churches, certifying to their appointment, these shall be entitled to a seat.
- 3. In the letters from the different churches shall be expressed their full number in fellowship; those baptized, received by letter, restored, dismissed by letter, excluded and deceased since our last Association.
- 4. The members thus chosen and convened shall have no power to lord over God's heritage, nor shall they have any clerical power over the churches, nor shall they infringe on any of the rights of any of the churches in the union.
- 5. The Association, when convened, shall be governed by a regular and proper decorum.
- 6. The Association shall have a moderator and assistant moderator, clerk, assistant clerk, and treasurer, who shall be chosen by the suffrage of the members present.
- 7. New churches may be admitted to this union, which shall petition by letter and delegates, and if found upon examina-

- tion to be orthodox and orderly, shall be received by the Association, and manifested by the moderator giving the right hand of fellowship.
- 8. Every church in the union shall be entitled to representation in the Association.
- 9. Every query presented by the churches to the Association, being first debated in their own church, shall come under the consideration of the Association.
- 10. Every motion made and seconded shall be considered by the Association, except it be withdrawn by the party who made it.
- 11. We think it absolutely necessary that we have an Association fund for defraying the expense of the same. For the raising of which we think it the duty of each church in the Union to contribute such sums voluntarily as they think proper, and send it by their delegates, to be deposited with the treasurer, who shall be responsible to the Association, and pay same out, as the Association may direct.
- 12. There shall be an Association book kept in which the proceedings of every Association shall be regularly recorded by the secretary, who shall receive annual compensation for same.
- 13. The minutes of the Association shall be read and corrected, if need be, and signed by the moderator and clerk before the Association rises.
- 14. Amendments to this plan of government may be made by majority of the union when in regular session, when so desired.

- 15. The Association shall endeavor to furnish the churches with minutes of the Association; the best method of effecting the same shall be determined by the Association.
- 16. All matters coming before the Association shall be decided by will of the majority of the members present.
- 17. The Association shall have the power to decide for the general union of the churches and to preserve an inviolable chain of communion among same, giving churches all necessary advice in matters of church difficulty; inquiring into the cause why any church shall

have failed to represent itself any time in the Association; appropriate the money received to any purpose it may think proper; appoint any member or members by their consent to transact any business which it may think necessary; withdraw from any church in the union which may violate any of the rules of the Association or deviate from the orthodox principles of religion; admit any orderly minister of our faith and order to a seat in the Association and adjourn to any time or place it may deem necessary.
